





Case Study: St Illtyd's Catholic High School's Story

Details:

St Illtyd's Catholic High School is located in an area of deprivation with a high percentage of Free School Meals pupils. This means many families are unable to pay to send their child on a youth development sailling day. With funding through local partners a fullyfunded Marine Skills Initiative was set up.

Voyages:

Over the past five years, Challenge Wales and St Illtyd's Catholic High school have developed a strong relationship. Twice a year, pupils from the school come onboard Challenge Wales for a day of training. Challenge Wales gives pupils a chance to have their first sailling experience, something they may not otherwise get the opportunity to do.



The Results:

- Pupils gained many skills from the sail training day with Challenge Wales, primarily team working and communication skills.
- Some children developed a passion for sailing as a hobby and they have gone on to do further sailing activities.
- •Since their sail onboard Challenge Wales, many students have participated on longer sail training voyages. And some of them plan to do further sail training trips in the UK.
- Some of the young people have applied for further funding to help them get sailing qualifications.
- •Two pupils returned as mentors and have had a positive influence on the new 'sailors' joining Challenge Wales for the first time.
