Following guidance from the Department of Education & Skills and Adventure Activities Licensing Authority Risk Assessments should not be sent out. Individual risk assessments are available to view in office or on board relating, for example, to weather, man overboard, sail handling, winch handling, catering and boarding the yacht etc. In line with Challenge Wales procedures, risk assessments and policies strictly adhered to. Instructions are given clearly to individuals participating in the activity before activity takes place. Participants are given induction and familiarisation tour and made aware of risks and hazards. Instructions are repeated where necessary. Safety briefings are in place for each trip before vessel departs pontoon with all participants and crew present. No smoking is allowed on the vessels Challenge Wales personnel are trained in how to handle equipment safely. Enhanced level of attention/supervision given by Challenge Wales personnel.
